**(You must do all of these steps each year per TEACH Grant rules.)**

1. Complete the 2018-2019 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). You do not have to demonstrate financial need to receive the TEACH Grant, but you must be deemed eligible to receive Federal Aid – the FAFSA verifies your eligibility.
2. You must meet one of the following academic achievement requirements: (1) Score above the 75<sup>th</sup> percentile on a college admissions test (e.g. SAT, ACT, or GRE), OR (2) Graduate from high school with a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 (on a 4.0 scale) to receive a grant as a freshman, OR (3) Have a cumulative GPA of at least 3.25 (on a 4.0 scale) on your college coursework to receive a Grant as a transfer student.

**NOTE:** You MUST maintain a 3.25 cumulative GPA to renew the award.

3. Complete TEACH Grant Entrance Counseling, sign a TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve (ATS) and respond to requests by the US Department of Education confirming your continuing intention to meet the teaching obligation.
